# Crime prevention advive.




Cars with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key fob comes within a short-range distance of the car.Keyless theft, also known as 'relay theft', occurs when device is used to fool the car into thinking the car's own remote key fob is close by; this unlocks the car and allows the ignition to be started.

### Is my car keyless entry?

If you have to press a button on your car's key fob to enter your car and turn the ignition with your key, then your car is not 'keyless' entry. Keyless entry cars allow the driver to unlock and start the car with the key fob still in their pocket / bag. Once in the car, the

driver can press a button to start the engine without ever needing to touch the key fob / remote.



### **How can I protect my vehicle?**

#### Keep car keys safe.

Whilst at home keep your car keys away from the car to disrupt communication range. Avoid leaving them near your door or window.





#### Use a signal-blocking pouch.

The pouch can block the transmission of the signal from the car key once inside the pouch.



#### Turn off the fob's wireless signal.

Wireless signals on some keyless fobs can be turned off. Look in your car manual to see it this is possible, if not, contact your vehicle manufacturer.





### Steering wheel lock.

Strongly consider reintroducing a steering wheel lock to your vehicle. This can be an effective tool in the fight against keyless thefts, purely for the reason that it cannot be compromised via technology.

#### **Parking**

If you have a garage, use it to secure your vehicle in.

If you park on the driveway, park as close to the property as you can.

If you have more than one vehicle on your driveway, park the less desirable vehicle in front of the more desirable vehicle to block its access.

# Crime Reports for April and May 2023

# **BURGLARY**

ARNOS GROVE N14. 05JUN23 at 5:25 am. Two unknown suspects wearing dark sport cloths, face covering and gloves enter the property by forcing open the front door using a crowbar. Alarm was triggered when the door was open. Suspects spent 60 seconds inside the property and left without stolen anything.

MORTON WAY N14,07JUN23 between 14:45 and 17:45, unknown suspect(s) have gained access to the property via smashing one of the front windows with an object unknown. An untyde search of premises has been conducted on both the ground and first floor. Property taken from within includes six gold bangles and a credit card.

**BROOMFIELD LANE N13**. 11JUN23 between 4:00 and 9:45. Unknown suspects enter the property via using an object unknown to gain entry through the front door. They took keys to the Range Rover, LM68XYY, from a black signal blocking box and removed the vehicle from the driveway. Two pairs of sunglasses were also stolen, one VERSACE and one PRADA.

#### BOWES ROAD N11 12JUN23 21:15 hrs.

Witnesses stated that four to five males, in balaclavas, forced their way into the venue, via the front door, before running back out and jumping into an awaiting vehicle. Nothing was stolen.

**DAWLISH AVENUE N13** 13JUN23 3:55 am. Attempt of burglary. Unknown suspect(s) broken a glass panel above the front door.

TOWSEND AVENUE N14, 13JUN23 at 4:00 hours. Attempt of burglary. A window was smashed and the door has been damaged. Victim was woken up by his alarm system blaring and had noticed when he went downstairs that a window had been smashed and that there were forced entry signs to his front door which has been damaged.

# **Going on holiday?**



To make your home look lived in, use automatic timer-switches to turn your lights on when it becomes dark.

Property mark belongings with your house number and postcode, take photos of property, particularly jewellery. Register your items for free at <a href="www.immobilise.com">www.immobilise.com</a>. Using this service will assist the police in returning property to the rightful owner should it be stolen and recovered.

Remember to cancel any milk or newspaper deliveries.

Avoid discussing holiday plans where strangers may hear details of your absence from home. Cut the lawn before you go and trim back any plants that cover windows and doors or places where people could hide.

Uncollected mail is a sign that you're away. Ask a neighbour or a friend to collect it for you or consider using the Royal Mail Keepsafe service. Store valuable documents or items in a safe. Alternatively consider leaving them with a family member, friend or a bank.

If you normally leave valuable pedal cycles or similar in your shed, consider putting them in the house.

Make sure valuable items such as laptops, games consoles etc. are not on view from the outside.

Lock tools, ladders etc. away so that they cannot be used to gain entry to your home. Consider fitting PIR or low-level lighting and, where necessary, extra window and door locks. Make sure you have up-to-date building and contents insurance and check for any specific requirements relating to security.


Make sure you've locked all your windows and doors, and if you have an alarm, use it!

While you're away

Consider getting a relative, friend or neighbour to park on your drive if you have one, open and close the curtains, collect the post from the mat and water the garden.

Be mindful of what you write or photos you share on social media which could identify you as being away on holiday.

Ask a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property and leave a contact number so they can get in contact with you if anything happens.


